#### \*Herefordshire LNRS (Local Nature Recovery Strategy) – Liz Duberley – Herefordshire Council - Update for 10.7.24

- The opportunities mapping is now complete and has been shared with LNRS team, we are just working through this at present and will share the highlights shortly.
- We held a species workshop earlier this week with HBRC and Natural England to review and agree priority species with our county recorders.
- LNRS engagement is now under way, this week and next we are holding several in-person workshops in the city and market towns to make contact with the public. We are also preparing a workshop with a specific focus on the landowning community, as well as further workshop with Members and Parish Councils. We will be publishing a series of self-serve webinars on our website.
- We are currently out to tender for the development of the strategy, the closing date is next week and we will then be reviewing submissions.
